

# Card Laminator

## **Instruction Manual**



Thank you for purchasing this product.

Please read through this "Instruction Manual" carefully in advance to ensure proper use of the product. Also, to make sure that the product is used safely, please read through the "Safety precautions". Please store the manuals properly after reading so that they can be referred to whenever necessary.

## **Characteristics of this Unit**

- This laminator attaches a protective layer to a single side of the printed card through infrared communication with the card printer.
- A hologram that helps to enhance the security level of the card can be formed on the protective layer.
- This laminator can be made to operate in conjunction with the card printer unit through infrared communication.
- It is built in with a function for adjusting the lengthwise position of the laminate film, which enables easy adjustment of the patch in the front-back direction.

## **Before Use**

#### If the abnormal phenomena as listed below are seen, immediately stop operating the unit. Continuing operation may cause a fire or electric shock.

- Smoke or odd smell comes out from the machine.
- Water or metal went into the machine.
- The unit fell to the floor, or the cabinet was broken.

• The power cable is damaged (exposed lead, broken cable, etc.) If you see these phenomena, turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and contact your dealer as soon as

possible. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

### Do not remove the screws, or disassemble or alter the machine.

- High-voltage components are contained in the unit. Touching these areas may result in an electric shock.
- Ask your dealer if you want your laminator inspected or repaired.
- Do not remove the external covers of the machine. You may get an electric shock.

#### Do not work on the power cable, or give excessive force on it. Do not put heavy objects such as furniture on the cable.

- The cable may be damaged, causing a fire or electric shock.
- When you find a defect on the power cable, such as exposed lead, stop using the unit, and consult your dealer.

## Do not use the machine with the power plug inserted incompletely.

- The machine generates heat due to incomplete contact, causing a fire or electric shock.
- Do not put many cords on a single plug socket. The power cords also heats up.

#### Do not use the machine with dusts piled on the power plug. Do not put a metallic material adjacent to the power plug.

- Dusts and metal are conductive, causing a fire or electric shock.
- Pull out the power plug from the outlet every six months, and clean the dusts piled on the legs and body of the plug.

#### Do not use a line voltage other than instructed.

• Using a line voltage or power supply which is not specified may cause a fire or electric shock.

- Do not put foreign materials from the openings of the machine (e.g., vents, card slots, cassette inlet, etc.)
- Metals, flammable things, and other foreign materials may cause a fire or electric shock if entering into the machine.
- If these things went into the machine, immediately turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and ask your dealer to repair. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

#### Do not put a container with liquid in it, or small metal ornaments and the like on the machine.

- The liquid or metal entering into the machine acts as a conductor, causing a fire or electric shock.
- If liquid or metal went into the machine, immediately turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and ask your dealer to repair. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

## Do not place the machine on a rickety table or slanting places.

- The machine may fall out of the table or fall over, which may damage the machine or injure you.
- If the machine is damaged by falling or turnover, immediately turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and ask your dealer to repair. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

#### Do not wet the machine with water.

- Using the machine at a place where water splashes on the machine, or wetting the machine with water (applying, throwing, or spilling water over the machine) may cause a fire or electric shock.
- If water entered into the machine, immediately turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and ask your dealer to repair. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

#### Do not touch the machine with wet hands.

• Touching the machine with wet hands may cause an electric shock.

#### Do not touch the power plug during electrical storms.

- Lightning may cause an electric shock.

## Ground the machine with the attached electric cord when connecting it to the utility outlet.

• Using a cord other than the one supplied for grounding may cause an electric shock when the machine fails.

#### Do not put your head or yourself into the packaging bag.

- Do not play with the packaging bag. You may suffocate yourself.
- Give close attention to small children who may want to play with the packaging bag.

#### Do not use the machine while it has a fault.

- Do not use the machine while it has a fault, as this may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Immediately turn off the power, pull out the power plug, and ask your dealer to repair. Do not try to repair it by yourself. It is dangerous.

#### Do not use the laminator when cards are jammed inside.

 Cards may not be discharged correctly such as when the laminator setting for the card is inappropriate.
 Stop using and remove the jammed cards immediately.
 Otherwise, you may have problems removing the cards, and fire or electric shock may also occur as a result.

## 

#### Pull out the power plug before cleaning the machine.

- This is for preventing electric shocks.
- Pull out the power plug when you won't use the machine for a prolonged period of time to assure safety.
- Remove the power plug from the outlet for safety when you won't use the machine for a long time.
- Do not move the machine with the power cable and other electric cables connected.
- The cables may be damaged while being moved, which may cause a fire or electric shock.
- You may stumble over the cable and get injured.

#### Do not move the machine with objects placed on it.

They may fall on you and hurt you.

#### Do not put heavy objects on the machine.

They may fall on you and hurt you.

#### Do not block the vents.

- Heat generated inside the machine cannot escape, which may cause a fire.

## Do not rest your body on the machine, or leave it suspended above the ground.

• The machine may drop, causing damage or injury. Pay particular attention when there are young children around.

#### Inspection

• Ask you dealer or a qualified person to inspect the machine, typically once every two to three years. Operating the machine with dusts piling on the components for a prolonged period of time may cause a fire or a malfunction of the machine. It will be particularly effective to inspect the machine before wet rainy season. Consult your dealer on the costs of inspection.

#### Do not place the machine in the following locations.

- Doing so may cause fire or electric shock.
- Places that are highly humid or dusty.
- Places that are exposed to oily smoke or steam, such as near a cooking table or humidifier.
- Places near a heating equipment.
- Places that are subject to water droplet condensation,
- such as beside a window.

Also, placing it at a place that is exposed to direct sunlight may result in deterioration of the cabinet.

#### Hold the body of the power plug when pulling it out.

• Do not pull out the plug by holding the cable. The cable may be broken or damaged which may in turn cause a fire or electric shock.

#### Do not touch the power plug with a wet hand

· You may get an electric shock.

#### Do not lay the power cable near the heating equipment.

• The covering of the cable will melt due to heat from such equipment, which may cause a fire or electric shock.

## The heat rollers and adjacent areas become hot during operation.

- When pulling out the film cassette or removing a jammed card, make sure that you do not touch the heating roller and its surroundings.
- $\cdot$  Wait until the heat rollers get cooled down to prevent burns.

#### Be sure to use the power cord supplied with this laminator.

 Using a power cord that is of a different voltage or a damaged power cord will result in fire or electric shock.

#### The power cord should be used only with this laminator.

- Do not use the power cord with products other than this laminator.
   Doing so may result in fire or electric shock.
- Hold the laminator at bottom of the two sides (handle) when installing or moving the laminator.
- Carrying the laminator by its corners or front and back may result in catching your fingers in between the laminator and the floor or table.
- Do not hold the rear filter cover when installing or moving the laminator.
- The filter cover may be damaged or detached from the laminator, causing the laminator to fall off and resulting in injuries.

## **Precautions During Use**

## Please read through all the following items before using the laminator.

#### Laminator Installation

- When you are not printing cards, it is recommended that you turn off the power, and use a cover that is large enough to cover up the card printer and laminator units.
- Avoid installing at the following locations as doing so may have adverse effects on this unit.
  - Carpeted room.
  - Places with a busy flow of people.
  - Places where paper (corrugated boards, etc.) is handled or stored.
  - Places near photocopiers.
  - Places exposed to direct sunlight or near a heating equipment (such as a stove).
  - Inclined or unstable surfaces.
  - Places exposed directly to cold air, such as near an airconditioner outlet, or places subject to high temperatures.
- During installation, make sure that there is sufficient space around the laminator. (Allow a clearance of at least 20 cm between the sides of the laminator and the wall. Allow a clearance of at least 10 cm between the rear of the laminator and the wall.)
- Observe the following when installing or moving the laminator.
  - Make sure to turn off the power before moving the laminator.
  - Carry the laminator at the bottom of the two sides (handle) to prevent your hands or fingers from being caught under the unit.
  - The filter cover is detachable for replacing the fan filter. When you are moving the laminator, do not hold it at the filter cover.

#### Films

#### Handling procedures

Pay attention to the following points when handling films.

- Do not touch the film surface with your hand. Doing so may result in poor adhesion.
- Foreign objects attached to the surface of the film may result in poor adhesion. Load the film in a clean environment.
- If the film is left unattended for a prolonged period of time with the laminator in the [Ready] state, the heat from the heater may cause the film to change color. When this unit is not in use, turn off the power, or switch it to the card printer's "Power-saving mode".
- When replacing films with one that has been stored under a low temperature, store it at the operating ambient temperature of the laminator for at least one hour before using. Otherwise, condensation may occur, causing poor adhesion or malfunction.

#### Storage environment

- Temperature: 5°C to 25°C
- Relative humidity: 50 % and below

#### Storage location

Do not store in the following locations.

- Places exposed to direct sunlight.
- Places with a high temperature and humidity.
- Places near organic solvents or diazo copiers.

#### Storage period

Use it as soon as possible after opening.

## Name and Functions of Parts

#### Front



#### 1 LED display (red)

Blinks or lights up in red, and combines with the 2 LED display (blue) to indicate the status of the laminator.

#### 2 LED display (blue)

Blinks or lights up in blue, and combines with the ① LED display (red) to indicate the status of the laminator.
 (ISF page 15 "Laminator Status, LED Display and Card

Printer's Operation Panel Display")

#### ③ Operation button

- Pressing this button when the laminate film is loaded will reset the laminator settings.
- When no film cassette is loaded, pressing the button for two seconds or longer starts the cleaning operation. (The cleaning operation does not start if the heating roller is still hot.)

#### (4) Sliding knob

• Opens/closes the laminator door.

#### **(5)** Laminator door

- Closing the door when the laminate film is loaded will reset the laminator settings.
- This door can be locked by operating in conjunction with the card printer unit through the security lock function.

#### (6) Power switch

• Turns the power on/off.

#### Rear



#### 1 Exhaust fan

- Discharges heat accumulated inside the laminator unit.
- (2) Air suction fan opening
- Air inlet of the internal cooling fan.

#### 3 Security slot

• An anti-theft device that supports Kensington locks can be attached.

#### (4) AC inlet

• For connecting the power cord.

#### Right



#### 1 Card feed port

• Feeds the printed card from the card printer that is connected to the laminator.

#### (2) Infrared window

• Sends or receives data via infrared communication by connecting with the card printer.

#### ③ Filter cover

- Remove when you want to exchange the filter.
- When moving the laminator, do not carry it at the filter cover.

#### (4) Handle

• Hold this area when moving the laminator.

#### Left



#### (1) Card outlet

• Discharges the cards.

#### 2 Card stacker attachment slot

For attaching the card stacker supplied with the card printer.

#### ③ Filter cover

- Remove when you want to exchange the filter.
- When moving the laminator, do not carry it at the filter cover.

#### (4) Handle

• Hold this area when moving the laminator.

#### When Laminator Door is Open



#### 1 Dummy cover

- Remove this when a card jam occurs.
- ② Jog dials insertion slot
- For discharging the card during a card jam by attaching the supplied jog dial to the card feed roller and turning it.
- (3) Film cassette (yellowish-green)
- For attaching the laminate film.
- (4) Cassette button
- Press the buttons to remove the film cassette.

#### **(5)** Jog dial attachment slot

• Enables attachment of a supplied jog dial to the card printer.

#### Film Cassette



#### 1 Guide shaft

• Provides guide to the position for attaching the film cassette.

#### Film Guides

- When attaching the laminate film, unwind it along the shafts.
- (3) Bobbin holder
- For securing the take-up side of the laminate film.
- (4) Bobbin holder (patch position adjustment mechanism attached)
- For securing the supply side of the laminate film.
- It can also be used to adjust the patch position in the front back direction.

## **Installation and Connection**

### **Installation Location**

- Ventilation holes for the cooling fan are located at the rear of the laminator as well as the side and rear of the card printer.
- Allow a clearance of at least 20 cm between the sides of the laminator and the wall.



• Allow a clearance of at least 10 cm between the rear of the laminator and the wall.



• Do not place any object on the laminator.



#### **Card Printer Connection**

**1** Fit the card printer to the supplied unit connection adapter



**2** Fit the laminator to the supplied unit connection adapter



#### Cautions: ·

- Do not hold the rear filter cover when installing or moving the laminator. The filter cover may be damaged or detached from the laminator, causing the laminator to fall off and resulting in injuries.
- Make sure that you connect the units on a flat and firm surface.
- Insert the unit connection adapter firmly into the card printer connection. Cards cannot be fed if there is a difference in level.
- After installation, if you need to remove the laminator from the card printer, turn off the power of the card printer.

#### **Card Stacker**

**1** Hook the tab of the card stacker that is supplied with the card printer to the card stacker attachment slot



- 1 Card outlet
- Card stacker attachment slot
- 3 Tab
- (4) Card stacker

#### **Power Cord Connection**

- **1** Insert the power cord (supplied) to the AC inlet at the rear of the laminator
- 2 Plug the power cord (supplied) into an outlet



#### Cautions: ·

• Make sure that the power outlet is grounded and used as a dedicated power source for the laminator. Make sure that the power cord is inserted directly into the outlet, and do not share with other devices.

#### Memo:

 Make use of an AVR (automatic voltage regulator) to prevent any fluctuation in voltage. Alternatively, an uninterruptible power supply is recommended in case momentary power outage occurs.

## **Setting Laminate Film**

• Attach a patch film or overlay film on the film cassette.

#### Cautions: -

- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.
- Make sure that the laminate film is attached in the right direction. Otherwise, film detection error may occur.
- A film detection error occurs if the attached laminate film does not coincide with the [Film Type] setting.
- **1** Open the laminator door



**2** Press and hold down the cassette button, and pull out the film cassette



- 3 Attach the tip of the new laminate film to the bobbin
- ① Place the new laminate film and the take-up bobbin side by side on a clean and flat platform.
- ② Attach the tip of the new laminate film to the take-up bobbin using the fixing tape.



Cautions: ·

- Attach the laminate film to the take-up bobbin such that they are parallel to each other.
   Otherwise, it may result in poor adhesion or cause film detection errors.
- 4 Install the new laminate film on the film cassette
  - Install while referring to the indication on the label of the cassette.



- (1) Insert the supply side of the film into the bobbin holders (patch position adjustment mechanism attached).
- ② Unwind the laminate film along the film guides, and insert the take-up side into the bobbin holders.



3 Wind the film twice around the take-up side.



5 Remove any slack in the laminate film



**6** Insert the film cassette all the way in along the guide rail until a "click" sound is heard, and close the laminator door



#### Cautions: ·

• Make sure to insert the film cassette all the way in until a "click" sound is heard. Failure to do so may result in defective patch or card jam.

## **Operation Panel**

- The status display of the laminator is displayed on the operation panel of the card printer as well as the status monitor of the computer that is connected to the card printer.
- The status is indicated on the laminator unit using a combination of solid and blinking LED displays in red and blue colors.

#### Card printer operation panel



#### 1 Printer status display

• Displays the status of the card printer.

#### (2) Laminator status display

 Displays the status of the laminator when the display mode of the card printer is set to [Laminator State].
 (I page 15 "Setting Procedures for Laminator Status Display")

#### ③ Status icon display

• A laminator icon is displayed once the card printer recognizes the laminator.

#### (4) Operation button

• For selecting a button function displayed on the operation panel.

#### Laminator operation panel



- 1 LED display (red)
- Indicates an error when only the red light is lit or blinking.

#### (2) LED display (blue)

• Indicates that the laminator is functioning normally when only the blue light is lit or blinking.

#### (3) Operation button

- Pressing this button when the film is loaded will reset the laminator settings.
- When no film cassette is loaded, pressing the button for two seconds or longer starts the cleaning operation. (The cleaning operation does not start if the heating roller is still hot.)

• You can display the laminator status on the operation panel of the card printer.

• Enter the setting mode.



#### 2 Press Next to set to [Setting]

• Pressing it each time displays the next setting item.



#### 3 Press Enter

• A [Display] message appears.



#### 4 Press Enter

• A [Mode] message appears.



#### **5** Press Change

• Enter the settings change mode.

#### **Checking the Laminator Settings**

- Settings can be viewed on the printer's operation panel.
- Settings can be changed on the status monitor of the computer that is connected to the card printer.

#### 1 Press Menu

• Enter the setting mode.



#### 2 Press Next to set to [Laminator]

• Pressing it each time displays the next setting item.



#### 3 Press Enter

- A [Mode] message appears.
- Pressing Next each time displays the next setting item and its current setting.



- 4 After checking is complete press **Exit** to exit the setting mode
  - Pressing it each time displays the setting item of the next higher level.

#### Laminator

- Mode: Laminate, Pass Set to [Laminate] to perform laminating. Set to [Pass] if you do not want to laminate.
- Cassette: None, Bottom The load status for the film cassette appears.
- Film-T: Feature is unavailable on this unit.

- Clean the roller after laminating about 1,000 cards.

- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.
- Each cleaning card can only be used once. Reusing a dirty card may dirty the roller or cause the laminator to malfunction. For details on the cleaning card, please consult our authorized dealers.
- Cleaning cannot be performed while the heating roller is still hot. Turn off the power, and perform cleaning after it has cooled down.

## Cleaning the laminator together with the card printer

### **Film Cassette**

• Due to the characteristics of the patch film, residues at the back of the laminate film may be attached to the film guide of the film cassette. Residues on the adhesive face of the laminate film may result in poor adhesion. When replacing the laminate film, check to ensure that no residues are attached to the film guides.

#### Cautions: -

- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.

#### **1** Open the laminator door



- 2 Remove any slack in the laminate film
  - Turn the knob on the film cassette in the direction indicated by the arrow.



**3** Press and hold down the cassette button, and pull out the film cassette



- 4 Remove the laminate film from the film cassette
- **5** Apply alcohol to a rag that does not produce lint easily (such as a cleaning wipe)
- 6 Wipe the four film guides



#### Cautions:

- Perform cleaning at a location away from the laminator so that residues do not enter the unit.

## **Interior of Laminator**

• Dirt during card feed or burrs caused by friction between the bobbin holder and bobbin may adhere to the card or film, causing lamination defects as a result.

#### Cautions: ·

- Start work after ensuring that the power has been turned off.
- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.

#### **1** Open the laminator door



- **2** Remove the dummy cover
- Press down the top of the triangle mark to remove the dummy cover.



- **3** Remove any slack in the laminate film
  - Turn the knob on the film cassette in the direction indicated by the arrow.

- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.

1 Check the position of the jammed card

- You can identify the position from the operation panel display of the card printer or the status monitor of the computer that is connected to the card printer.
- In the case of [Jam (In)], the card is automatically discharged when the laminator is reset. If the card is not discharged automatically, remove them by following the steps below.
- Do not reset the laminator in cases of [Jam (Middle)] and [Jam (Out)]. Remove them by following the steps below.

## Film is Entangled

 When the film cassette is taken out and the film is entangled due to the laminate film been peeled off from the film cassette or card jams, use the methods below to untangle and reattach the film.

#### Cautions:

- If the security lock of the card printer is on, deactivate it. After work is complete, activate the security lock again. For details on locking/unlocking the security lock, refer to the manual of the card printer.
- Stand the film cassette on a flat surface. Avoid doing so on a floor as dust attached to the film may cause poor adhesion or malfunction.
- A film cassette that has laminate film attached on it is heavy. Hold the film cassette with both hands to avoid dropping when working with it.

#### If the laminate film is not damaged

1 Install the new laminate film to the film cassette

• Install while referring to the indication on the label of the cassette.



**2** Turn the take-up side using your hand to take up the used portion of the film



**3** Remove any slack in the laminate film



**4** Insert the film cassette all the way in along the guide rail until a "click" sound is heard, and close the laminator door



#### If the laminate film is damaged

**1** Cut away the damaged portion using a pair of scissors



**2** Insert the supply side of the film into the bobbin holder (patch position adjustment mechanism attached), and the take-up side into the bobbin holder



**3** Attach the unused portion at the supply side to the other end at the take-up side using an adhesive tape, while making sure that the joint surface is even



**4** Turn the take-up side using your hand until the broken portion can no longer be seen



5 Remove any slack in the laminate film



**6** Insert the film cassette all the way in along the guide rail until a "click" sound is heard, and close the laminator door



#### Cautions:

• Make sure to insert the film cassette all the way in until a "click" sound is heard. Failure to do so may result in defective patch or card jam.

## **Misaligned Patch Position**

• The patch position may vary slightly with respect to the card depending on the type of film used and the different methods used during the manufacturing process. If the patch position is not properly aligned, adjust it accordingly.

#### If patch position is displaced to the left/right



 You can adjust the setting on the status monitor of the
 Right computer that is connected to the card printer. ( Page 20 "Status Monitor Settings")

#### Cautions:

• Setting the patch position to a position beyond the edge of the card may result in card jams. Make sure to adjust the patch position nearer to the center of the card.

#### If patch position is displaced to the front/back



- Turning the patch position adjustment mechanism of the film cassette enables you to adjust the patch position to the front or back by 0.25 mm.
- The maximum displacement of the patch position adjustment mechanism is ±1 mm from the standard position.
- Adjust the scale in the + direction to move the patch position to the back.
- Adjust the scale in the direction to move the patch position to the front.





#### Cautions:

- Apply the above procedures if there is significant misalignment in the patch position.
- Do not rotate the patch position adjustment mechanism over ±1 mm. Doing so may damage it.

## **Card Warpage**

• During laminating, heating by the heating roller may cause warpage in cards with a low heat resistance, such as PVC ones.

#### If card is significantly warped

- Lowering the temperature or increasing the speed helps to reduce the heat load on the card, thus causing less warpage. Alter the temperature and speed gradually while making sure that the adhesiveness is not affected.
- Settings can be changed on the status monitor of the computer that is connected to the card printer.

#### Laminating Condition Settings

Cautions:

- If cards with low heat resistance are used, applying a large heat load at once causes the card to deform significantly, and this may in turn cause card jam inside the laminator unit. Alter the temperature and speed gradually.
- Reimbursement will not be done for poor adhesion or card warpage. For more information about the card, please consult our authorized dealers and evaluate the settings.
